They were eager to take advantage of the natural views and select materials that conveyed warmth without losing harmony with the local environment.

The result of the design is a transformed interior that unifies the kitchen, dining, and living spaces through a consistent style, achieving a serene and visually light atmosphere.

Through use of a neutral color palette, natural textures, and a balanced layout, a space is created that invites you to relax, socialize, and feel enjoyment from the moment you walk in.




LG House: Laundry Room, Before

I was contacted by a family with a home in Cuernavaca who wanted to transform their laundry room as, due to the layout of the house, it is a space that guests must regularly pass through to reach other areas.

The laundry area was not very functional, cluttered, and had no adequate storage.

This disorder affected the harmony of the home, and was functionally impractical.

My design proposed an orderly and aesthetic space using closed storage, neutral materials, and spot lighting.

At the client's request, the traditional Mexican sink is integrated into the design, maintaining its functionality in a way that creates harmony with the other elements of the design.

The result is an area that looks and feels more spacious, bright, and welcoming, with lighting that is pleasing and practical for a space that doubles as a utility area and a throughroom in the home.



LG House: Storage Area, Before

This storage area shares a common passageway with the laundry area. The space was heavily cluttered with rarely-used belongings, piled up randomly and in plain sight, without order.

The space lacked harmony as was not an agreeable experience for people using the passageway.






LG House: Storage Area, Now

To solve this, my design proposed an integrated piece of custom-made furniture that features a modular system for orderly storage and a new visual experience in this space of the house.

The result is a transformed space characterized by visual cleanliness, rescued from clutter, and giving the client efficient access to their things when needed.


This solution restores a sense of order and calm when passing through this area of the home and provides a practical solution for the clutter.



LG House: Underused Room, Before

The family's home included a room with no specific purpose and over time ended up becoming an underused area for drying an ironing clothes.

The family wanted to transform this space into a practical, multi-functional, room, but were not sure exactly how to make best use of it.





LG House: Underused Room, Now

To address this element of the design, I talked to the client about the types of uses they might wish put this space to, and they expressed an interest in having a a home office, and a space for guests to stay overnight.

The schema I proposed includes an elegant storage solution through a single piece of furniture that makes full use of the limited space by extending to the ceiling. This piece also incorporates an ergonomic desk for home working.

The guest bed provides adequate accommodation for occasional overnight stays.

A versatile, well-organized, and welcoming room was created, where each element serves a clear function without visually cluttering the space.



LV House: Laundry Room, Before

The original laundry area of this house was small and cramped, and when the family did their laundry here they always felt restricted and uncomfortable.

The exposed fixtures, the clutter, and lack of adequate storage made the space feel unpleasant.

The washing machine was difficult to load and unload, and the entire space was impractical for its intended purpose, despite it being used on a daily basis.



LV House: Laundry Room, Now


To make the most of a relatively small space, my design solution proposed custom-made furniture that brought order and beauty the laundry area.

The water heater and fixtures, previously exposed, are now hidden and a specially designed module is introduced to accommodate the washing machine.


The new schema makes the machine easier to use on a daily basis, and makes full use of the limited space.

The furniture also provides ideal storage for laundry consumables, keeping them out of sight but easily accessed.


This design transformed a space that was avoided into one that now feels clean, well-organized, and calm, and which the family enjoys using.




LV House: Laundry Room, Before (2)




LV House: Laundry Room, Now (2)

This bathroom, that was the original design from when the house was built, carried an uncomfortable and impractical layout.


The space to work with is limited, and the client wanted the shower area be enlarged without sacrificing space for the other essential elements of the space that included a wash basin and a toilet.




EVA Apartment: Bathroom, Transformed

The new design incorporated neutral colors and aesthetic elements including frosted glass for the shower area and for the window, different distribution, creating a feeling of more spaciousness and clarity.

The shower is now more comfortable, and the rest of the bathroom flows with a more balanced, practical, and visually harmonious composition.
